

Well done to Kayla coming 4th place and preforming new elements in her program.










OBERSTDORF INTERNATIONAL
















Sponsorships opportunity

Guess Who?# I started skating and joined polar club at 6

years old after going to a friend's birthday party, fell in love with the sport. My sister began skating at the same time in ice bears. I competed my first national competition in Bradford at 9 years old and moved through the national levels to completing my first senior season last year. I participated in many shows including The Creative Sprit of John Curry, as well as Whitley Bay's Christmas shows, and have been involved in organising Whitley Bay's Ice Hockey cheerleaders given me experience in the sport outside of skating.

Recently qualified as a coach, I have began to pass my knowledge and experience onto the next generation of skaters.

I started skating at the age of 10 and joined poler club with no intention of becoming a figure skater, I was more interested in learning to skate and start ice hockey but it didn't quite work out that way and was competing in open comp fairly soon.

I competed up to level 8 in solo skating and somewhere along to the way started skating pairs.

I stopped competing in solo skating in 2009 to focus on pairs and got second place in advanced novice at the British championships.

My ice skating journey began many years ago in a Latvian city called Daugavpils. We didn't have any ice rinks in my hometown until 1999. Coincidentally, the grand opening took place on the same day as my birthday, so I like to think it was a sign. I had just turned 12, which was a bit late for a professional skating career, but thanks to my enthusiasm and strong athletic background (in gymnastics and ballroom dancing), I managed to catch up quickly.

My best achievements include 5th place at the Junior Nationals and several top 3 at international competitions. I'm very proud of that! I wouldn't call myself a very competitive skater. I was more of a show girl. You could probably tell by my obsession with red lipstick and the gems on my coach's jacket ,hahaha.

I moved to Newcastle in 2011. The reason was love \Box but that's a long story ,I'll tell you more next time. "The North" has been very kind to me. I fell in love with the place and the people, and here you go, so many years later, I'm still here!
